There are 3 main types of writing. Choose one of the following to write a paragraph (or more) about this biography person.

★ **Narrative:** Tells a story about a person or event. It includes characters, setting, and a plot. This can also include a sequence of events, dialogue, feelings, and cause and effect.

Example Writing Prompt(s): Pick an event in this person's life and retell it in a short narrative.



## OPTIONAL Language Arts Add-On

- ★ **Expository/Information:** Gives information or facts about a topic. It starts with an introduction and ends with a conclusion. It can also include vocabulary words specific to the topic.

Example Writing Prompt(s): What was this person most known for? What factors contributed to their personal growth? Write a brief expository/information paragraph (or more) about this person, choosing some of your favorite pieces of information about this person.

- ★ **Persuasive/Opinion:** Tells readers the writer's opinion on a topic. It begins with an introduction, lists reasons to support the writer's opinion, and ends with a conclusion.

Example Writing Prompt(s): Did this person make a positive or negative influence on society? What factors contributed to their personal growth or lack thereof? Write a brief persuasive/opinion paragraph (or more) trying to convince your reader to agree with your opinion of this person.
